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## Topping Off with Wood

Designers Marita Simmons and Krysta Gibbons discuss important considerations when contemplating wood countertops.

- Select the right species. In the Lewises' kitchen, the designers went with walnut for the island countertop. "Their countertop isn't stained; it's just oiled. You just wouldn't get that richness using maple," Gibbons says.
- Embrace imperfection. Wood countertops aren't supposed to be pristine. With everyday use, a wood countertop will collect nicks, dents, and patina over time, and that only adds to its beauty.
- Prioritize maintenance. As with virtually any countertop surface, proper care and maintenance will ensure your wood countertop looks its best. Applying mineral oil or walnut oil once a month prevents the wood from drying out. It also helps control bacteria, which keeps the surface safe for food preparation.
